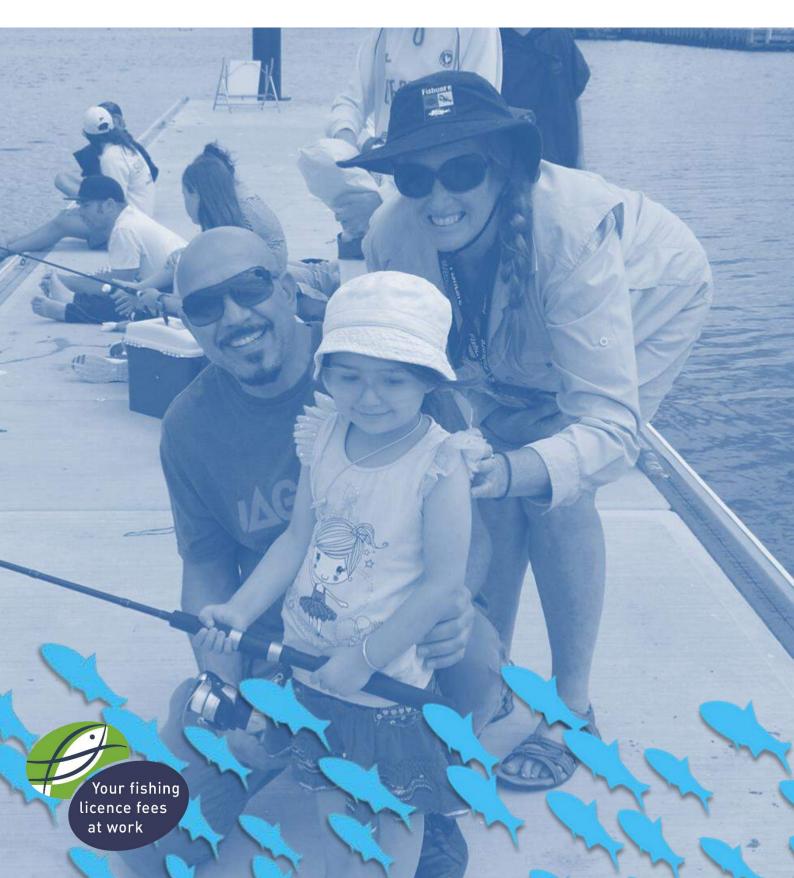


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Mission Statement

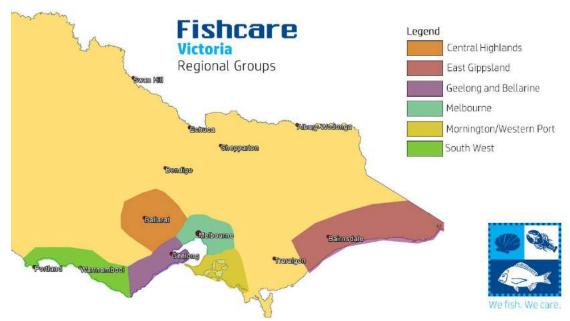

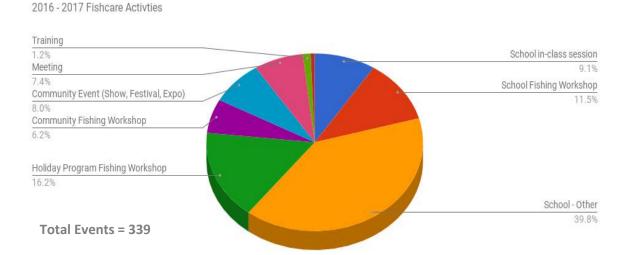


- Raising public awareness of the dangers to our fish and aquatic mammals caused by litter entering waterways;

Fishcare Victoria Activities 2016-17

Another productive year has seen 339 events delivered by the Fishcare community across the state. Along with our core program, Fishcare Victoria is currently delivering the "Creating Sustainable Anglers" project which targets school groups and delivers sustainable recreational fishing workshops to schools, holiday programs and community events across Victoria. This financial year we have reached a total of 8609 participants and our volunteers have invested over 2025 hours of their time to achieve the Fishcare Victoria key objectives. 357 hours have been direct contact hours with our participants.

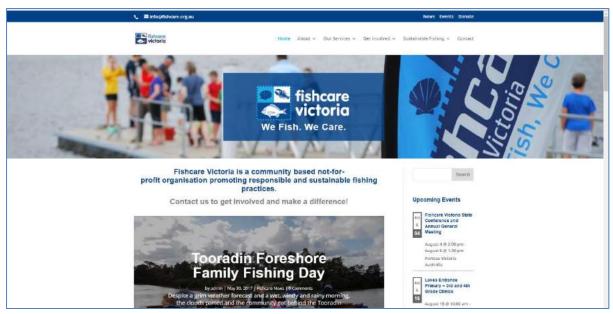

Online reporting of group activities has enabled the statewide reporting of our activities and staff to have statistics in real time.

Treasurer's Report

As was the case last year Fishcare Victoria Inc. has had another strong year financially due to the continued support of the Recreational Fishing Licence (RFL) Working Group and fisheries Victoria.

What we still have not overcome is our virtual total reliance on the RFL funds. This remains an ongoing concern for the organisation and finding a way of overcoming this dependence must be one of the priorities of the new financial year even if it means moving to some degree in directions away from our long term core activities.

Income & Expenditure

Income for the 2016-17 financial year totalled \$260,185, up \$27,526 from the previous financial year. The majority of the income, \$195,163, received from the RFL as the 4th year of our 5 year baseline funding. We also received \$32,737 from the RFL CSA programme. Fishcare received \$3,212 in service Fees compared to just \$300 last year.

Expenditure for the year totalled \$260,009, up \$4,751 from last year. The major expenditure items were employee expenses \$189,565, up by \$17,529 from last year, though this was partly reflecting salary increases, there was a notable increase in staff travel and accommodation costs, Administration costs \$18,213 down \$4,970 due to reduced rental costs, volunteer travel \$8,623, down \$3,053. Finally though there has been some reclassification of expenditure items Education resources and Material & Product Updates at \$720 were down \$25,413, printing costs substantially reduced.

In addition to the above expenditure items the costs of accumulated Annual Leave, Long Service Leave and Time In Lieu expenses were included in the accounts for the first time, a total of \$14,911. The inclusion of these items better reflects the true financial burden of the organisation's activities. Fishcare for the year virtually broke even recording a surplus of \$176.

Investments

Fishcare Victoria took a more cautious approach to investing un-utilised project funds this year as a result Interest Income was \$622 compared to \$2,140 last year.

Assets

This year the organisation purchased two laptops costing a total of \$2,175, one of which was funded by a grant of \$1,150 from the City of Greater Geelong. Please see the depreciation schedule on page 20.

Public Fund

The Public Fund continued to receive generous donations from the public giving it an income of \$1,413 for the year. During year the fund was utilised to donate \$1,000 to the Australian River Restoration Centre, an organisation deducted to improving fish habitat in our waterways.

I look forward to many more clinics in Tidal River and I am glad that the relationship with Parks Victoria in Wilson's Promontory has been revitalized.

In conjunction with Fishcare Geelong/Bellarine, we have been able to further grow our relationship with the Marine and Freshwater Discovery Centre by attending multiple clinics with Lara Secondary College, Bellarine Secondary College, Axedale Primary and Summer Holiday Programs.

Within the Fishcare Melbourne and Mornington region, we had many successful clinics with return schools and school holiday programs such as Somerville Secondary College, Rangebank Primary School, Darebin Parklands Junior Rangers, Portsea Camp
